Coercive control is the underpinning of abuse and understanding the circumstances of your clients will help you to better prepare for how the system is often used to further harm these individuals. Learn how coercive control is inflicted upon victims-survivors and how perpetrators attempt to further wield the court system to wield legal abuse. This evidence- based training will fully support you as you navigate these challenging cases, often incorrectly referred to as "high conflict."
